UNITED STATES COPYRIGHT LAW

IN FORCE ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 1909

SECTION 28.—That any person who wilfully and for profit shall infringe any copyright secured by this Act, or who shall knowingly and wilfully aid or abet such infringement, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment for not exceeding one year, or by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court.

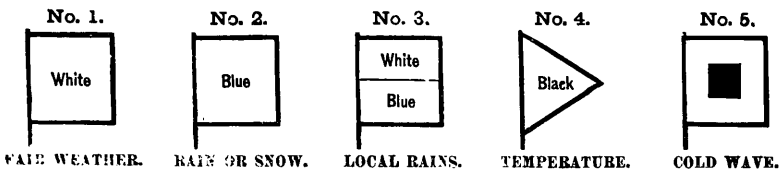

WATER RATES.

\$1.35 per 1,000 cu. ft. for each service taking less than 20,000 cu. ft. per month. For each service taking more than 20,000 cu. ft. per month, \$1.35 per 1,000 cu. ft. for the first 20,000 cu. ft. per month, \$1.20 per 1,000 cu. ft. for the next 80,000 cu. ft. per month, and \$1.05 per 1,000 cu. ft. for all in excess of 100,000 cu. ft. per month.

When more than one water service enters one and the same piece of property and the consumption of water thereon exceeds 100,000 cu. ft. per month, and all such water is used for one and the same business or commercial purpose, then the charge for water may be based upon the combined usage from all the services instead of each service separately.

The minimum charge for water under these rates shall be \$1.50 per quarter of three months.

A charge of \$10.00 per quarter of three months shall be made for each city owned Fire Service meter which is or may be installed on any premises.

Metered Water Bills—Payable quarterly. \$1.35 per 1,000 cubic feet. Minimum \$6.00 per year.

TAXES.

City Taxes payable May 1—Fees will be added as follows:—

June 1, ½ per cent.; June 16, 1 per cent.; July 1, 1½ per cent.; July 16, 2 per cent.; Aug. 1, 2½ per cent.; Aug. 16, 3 per cent.; Sept. 1, 3½ per cent.; Sept. 16, 4 per cent.; Oct. 1, 4½ per cent.; Oct. 16, 5 per cent.; Nov. 1, 5½ per cent.

After November 15, 5½ per cent., and also interest from that date at the rate of 10 per cent. per annum. A warrant may be issued for taxes and interest, with collector's fees added after November 15th.

County Taxes payable January 1—Fees will be added as follows:—

All of January without fees; February 1st to February 14th inclusive, 1 per cent.; February 15th to February 28th inclusive, 2 per cent.; March 1st to March 14th inclusive, 3 per cent.; March 15th to March 31st inclusive, 4 per cent.; April 1st to April 14th inclusive, 5 per cent.

After April 14th said addition of 5 per cent and also interest from that date at the rate of 12 per cent per annum.

A warrant may be issued for taxes and fees and interest with collector's fees of 5 per cent. added after April 14th.

On August 1st an additional fee of \$1.00.

On the 15th day of August a list of all unpaid taxes will be published.

On the 20th day of August all unpaid taxes will be sold, and can be redeemed only by paying advertising and sale charges, with interest.

Checks payable to Monroe County Treasurer, and mailed, will be accepted.

Office hours 10 A.M. to 3 P.M. Saturdays 10 A.M. to 12 M.

The original Water Works were begun in July, 1873, and completed in February, 1876. They embrace two distinct systems of water distribution from two separate sources. The first or principal one is the gravity system from Hemlock Lake as source, which now includes three conduits and 443 miles of distributing pipe; the second is the Holly System which derives its supply from the Genesee River and serves essentially in affording a more efficient fire protection in the central and manufacturing districts of the city, the extent of distributing pipe connected therewith being about 25 miles. Total length of distributing pipes, in city, of both systems, about 468 miles.

Conduit I consists of 9.8 miles of 36-inch, and 3 miles of 24-inch wrought-iron riveted pipe, and 15.5 miles of 24-inch cast-iron pipe; total length of conduit I is 28.3 miles.

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Library—Number of books in the Library, 52,163.

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The temporary administration offices and library workrooms are in Building No. 9 at Edgerton Park. Heretofore the library's activities have been confined to branch libraries, sub-branches, deposit stations and school and playground libraries. When the city accepted Mr. George Eastman's offer of the Cluett-Peabody building for the temporary housing of certain city departments, a limited but attractive space was assigned to the Public Library in which to start a central library book collection. Plans which have been made for that work will be put into effect in the course of the year.

Each of the branch libraries is open every day in the year from 2 to 9 P. M. for reference and circulation, except the Business Branch, which is open week days during business hours, from 9 A. M. to 6 P. M.

Deposit stations are small collections of books placed for a time wherever they can be of service to a number of people.

Class Room Libraries—The Library has charge of the 611 grade libraries in the public schools, 18,413 volumes. These libraries consist of about 35 volumes each of general children's literature. Under the care and direction of the teachers they are circulated among the children in the schools for home use.

Playground Libraries—The playground libraries established by the Park authorities are also under the supervision of the Public Library. This collection numbers 977 volumes, which are circulated from eleven playgrounds.

During 1924 there were issued for home use 1,485,468 volumes from ten branches, twelve sub-branches eighty-seven stations, 592 class rooms and eleven playgrounds.

The City appropriation for library purposes in 1925 is \$205,639.42.

By enactment of the legislature, all positions in the public service of Rochester (excepting those filled by public election, the heads of departments and confidential subordinates), must be filled from applicants who have successfully passed an examination by a Board of civil service examiners, or from registered list of laborers.

A Board consisting of three members is appointed by the Mayor, who also appoints the secretary and chief examiner.

Whenever a position is to be filled, the examining Board will notify the applicants on record, to appear for examination, and appointments must be made by the appointing power from the list prepared by the commission.
