States to be held for him in trust by a Mr Schuyler
The son of a Mr Peter Schuyler who was a man
of great influence with the Indians of the 6 Nations
before the late Sir William Johnson. Mr S.
purposes to return to Niagara this Autumn.

Mr Street has been informed by Gen. Knox

to the Legislature which appointed them. In consequence
