HISTORT

Tens Church was organized Nov. 4th, 1811. The following is from the minutes of the Church at that date: "On this day is a Church of Christ organized, of the Congregational order, in the town of Parma, by Rev. Reuben Parmele, of the following members, viz : Samuel Davis, Daniel Arnold, James Ferring. ton, Josiah Mather, Jabez Busley, Benjamin Freeman, Abigail Busley, Phebe Finch, Lydia Mitchell, and Betsey Nichols." The town of Parma and the Church then formed included the region now embraced in the towns of Parma and Ogden. The Rev. EBENEZER EVERETT was installed pastor of said Church near the commencement of the year 1819. About the same time the Caurch now called the Congregational Church in Parma and Greece, was set off, and the original Church assumed the name of the Congregational Church of Ogden. Rev. E. Everett was dismissed from his pastoral charge in 1822, and the Rev. Averys SEDGWICK was ordained and installed in his room in the year About the same time the present edifice in which public worship is held, was dedicated by Rey, Alvan Hyde, D. D. of Lee, Mass. During the ministry of Mr. Sedgwick two powerful revivals were enjoyed-one in 1827, in which sixty were added to the Church by profession : and in the other, which occurred during the year 1831, there were about one hundred and thirty. He was dismissed in July, 1833. Rev. Conway P. Wing, the prement pastor, was installed March 24th, 1835. There have been since that time two or three seasons of special interest, in which the Church has been somewhat increased. Immediately at the close of one such season about the commencement of the year

1837, when Ching's was organized at Adams' Basin, consisting of twenty-free president. The Church became connected with the Presbytery of Rachaster at the same time with the Installation Maller should be a few or consists of 241 members.

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FORM OF ADMISSION OF MEMBERS.

[When any person or persons present themselves for admission to the Church an a profession of their faith, the officiating minsiter should set forth in a brief manner the duty, the object, and the solemnity of such a profession, the encouragements hold out by divine grace, and the various obligations which are thereby acknowledged and assumed. He may then propose to them the following as their]

CONFESSION OF FAITH.

You believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God—that they are the only infallible rule of religious faith and practice, and that they teach us the following general and important truths, viz:

- I. That God is a being of infinite natural and moral perfections, and though in the most perfect sense he is One, yet He exists in three equal persons, distinguished as Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
- II. That God created all things, visible and invisible, ever governs them according to his benevolent will, and for the regulation of his intelligent creatures has given a perfect law, to which, under all possible circumstances of their being, they are bound to render complete obedience,

III. That our first parents in their original state were perfect. ly holy, but by disobedience they fell, in consequence of which all their poeterity are, by nature, prone to sin, and therefore children of wrath.

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IV. That all mankind do invariably though voluntarily sin, and while unrenewed are totally destitute of all holiness in the sight of God, and condemned already under his everlasting curse,

V. That God in his infinite and eternal mercy, having determined upon the redemption of his chosen, gave his beloved Son to die, who has made an ample atonement for the sins of all mankind, through which all may by faith have a sure title to everlasting life.

VI. That the unmerited grace of God is freely offered through Christ to the vilest and the chief of sinners—that none will ever perish but in consequence of the most criminal neglect of it, but that such is the enmity of the human heart that no one will ever come to Christ until he is effectually called by the sovereign and regenerating influences of the Holy Spirit.

VII. That none will obtain eternal life but those who continue faithful until death—that of ourselves, we often fall into grievous sin, and are daily liable utterly to fall away and perish, yet that God has promised finally to justify the believer on his first act of real faith in Christ, and to keep him by divine power through faith unto salvation.

VIII. That Jesus Christ has a true Church in the world, composed of visible saints, with which all his people are graciously permitted, and without exception commanded to connect themselves in brotherly love and holy followship.

IX. That Baptism and the Lord's Supper are perpetual ordinances in the Church, the latter of which is to be administered to credibly professing believers, and the former to them and to their households by the application of water in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Chost.

X. That at the end of the world Christ shall raise the dead, judge the world, doom the wisked to endless misery, and admit the righteous to his holy and heavenly mansions, where they shall be for ever with the Lord.

The candidates having thus publicly adopted and professed their belief in the foregoing summary of Christian Doctrine and Duty, Baptism may be administered te such as have not previousty received it, after which may be proposed the following:

COVENANT.

Sonsible of your great weakness and infinite unworthiness, with fervent prayer to him without whose grace all human dependence is vain, you do now before God and this Assembly adopt the following as your solemn coverant, viz:

To God, you unreservedly consecrate yourselves, your influence, your time, your property, and all you can command, to be held by you entirely subject to his disposal. You commit your selves to his promises as your only hope, and to his word as your invariable guide, resolving that it shall be the supreme object of your life to glorify his name in an humble effort to copy all the virtues of the Savior.

In reference to yourselves, you promise to allow of no known sin either in your heart or conduct, that you will daily devote a season to secret prayer and self-examination, that you will strictly hallow the sacrod Sabbath, and give constant diligence to grow in grace and in the knowledge of your Lord and Savier Jesus Christ.

In the Families where you are or may be at the head, you promise morning and evening to maintain social wership and ever to enforce religious discipline and a pious education among all who may be committed to your care.

Among your Fellow.men, you promise ever to seek the elevation of all within your influence, to be meek and gentle to your enemies, honest in your dealings, kind to the afflicted, and benevolent toward all mankind.

The Church of God you promise evermore to love—to prefer her interests above your chief joy, and that so long as you contiage a member of this branch of it you will be tender and affec-

tionate toward all its members—attend upon its mestings for "prayer, and all its institutions and ordinances—each its purity, its peace and its prosperity—submit to its discipline, and endeaver in all your conduct to adorn the doctrine of God your Savior. All this, in divine strength, you severally profess and engage.

[Here those who are to be received by letter may be called, and having presented themselves may signify their assent to the following question:]

Do you adopt and assent to the Confession of Faith and Covemant of this Church—promising obedience and adherence to them in all things so long as God may continue your connection with it?

[Having signified their assent, the following may be presented:]

Having heretofore, dear brethren, avowed your faith in Christ and witnessed a good profession among your brethren in the Lord, who have now commended you to our affection and fellowship, you do now renew that profession among us, and here publicly enter into covenant with this Church—and while you esteem it a privilege to enjoy the counsel and admonitions of your brethren and sisters, you solembly engage that you will watch over them and their interests with all Christian fidelity and tenderness; that you will affectionately remember them in your prayers, and seek the peace and prosperity of this branch of Zion and of the whole militant kingdom of God. Thus you now solemnly engage in humble reliance on the aid of the Holy Spirit.

[The whole Church may here arise, when the candidates by letter and profession may be publicly accepted in the following manner:]

We do now therefore, their brethren and sisters, receive you to our warm affection and fellowship, promising you the support and countenance of this Church in every good word and work, and its

faithful intercessions and admonitions. We walcome you to our labors, our trials, our joys and pur system place for a few wors alumbers or sleeps, ever guald your and like who is the bread of life be your support and consolation, and having made you an ernament to his Church below, may be finally produce us all without spot or wrinkle or any such thing before the throne of his Eternal Majesty on high, Amen.

RESOLUTIONS.

The following have been adopted as standing Rules and Regulations in the Church:

- I. A meeting of the whole Church will be held on every third Wednesday of each month for conference and prayer, and for the transaction of any business relating to the general interests of the Church and which, properly comes before the body of its members.
- II. It is expected that every member will contribute a due proportion to the funds of the Congregation and to the different standard objects of behevolence, and it is the opinion of this Church that a gross failure in this duty is a proper subject of discipline;
- III. If any member of the Church is absent from the Sacrament of the Lord's supper habitually for one year, without a satisfactory reason, it shall be the duty of any member of the Church who is aware of the offence to cause the regular steps of discipline to be taken against such a person that he may be dealt with as a violator of his solemn covenant.
- 1V. If any person is known to be absent from the bounds of this Church for a longer time than one year without taking a letter of dismission, or if he has one and does not present it, unless he can render a reasonable excuse, he shall be considered as walking disorderly; and if possible he shall be reminded of his duty and reported to the Church hearest to which he may reads.
- V. Members from other Churches in fellowship and correspondence with us, and who come to reside among us, and who shall

not present themselves for admission to the Church within six months after they have become residents fiere, shall be devied the privilege of communion with us after that period, and it shall be theduty of the minister officiating in this Church to report them to the Churches to which they belong, unless satisfactory reasons be offered for such a delay.

VI. We as a Church feel ourselves required by the spirit of the Gospel to abstain entirely from the use of ardent spirits, except in quee of bodily burt, or sickness, and for mechanical uses; and such abstances is with this Church an invariable condition of membership.

VII. Although the Office of the ruling Elders who shall constitute the Session of this Church shall be considered as perpetual, according to Chap, XIII: § 6 of the Constitution of the Presby, terian Church, yet it shall be understood that those who are elected shall actually officiate or serve this Church for a term of time not exceeding six years from the time of their election, unless invited by a regular vote of the Church to continue.

VIII. It shall be understood by every member of this Church that in no case whatsoever will any member avail himself of the right of carrying any case of appeal or complaint to any ecclesiastical indicatory above preshytery for a decision.

IX. An Election of two persons to serve as Elders in this Church shall be held on the day of the Monthly Conference in March of every alternate year beginning with the year 1835.

X. Whenever the Church is about to proceed to the Election of an Elder or Deacon the moderator of the meeting shall appoint a committee of five who shall nominate to the meeting double the number of persons to be elected, from which the Church shall elect by ballot the number requisite at the time.

XI. No meeting of the Church for the election of officers shall be considered as regular unless notified from the desk two successive. Sabbaths immediately preceding the election.

XIL No Letters of Dismission or Recommendation to member-

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ship in other Churches shall be granted to any members of the Church who are known to be indebted to the Trustees of this Society and refuse to pay their subscription.

XIII. It shall be considered an immorality for any person to spend any portion of the sacred time of the Lord's day in the common secular pursuits of the week; such as working on the Farm, in the Shop, or Office, even under the prospect of heavy pecuniary losses or inconvenience.

XIV. We believe the spending of holy time in the pursuit of our own pleasure, such as giving and receiving social visits, journeys to neighboring towns merely to gratify ouriestly, visiting on attending upon the Post Office, and all traveling for pecuniary advantage or for pleasure, is also a violation of duty and scrupulously to be avoided.

XV. That the voluntary owning of stock in any company in trade or otherwise, which is used in violating the sacredness of the Lord's day in any of the above mentioned ways, is also to be considered an immorality.

XVI. This Church feels it to be its duty to sustain all proper efforts to discipline any members who are or may be guilty of any such violations as have been camerated in the foregoing resolutions on the subject of the Sabbath, and it accordingly hereby pledges itself to co-operate in all proper ways to promote such discipline.
