
HIGH SCHOOL.

The friends of education in the city of Rochester have for many years felt the importance of the establishment of a High School or Free Academy, in order to complete the system of free schools so honorably inaugurated by this city. Through the commendable zeal and persevering efforts of the present Board of Education, this work has at length been successfully accomplished, and the citizens of Rochester can now congratulate themselves on having within their midst a free school of the highest grade, where their sons and daughters can secure a thorough and extensive education.

The establishment of a High School having thus ceased to be problematical, there only remains the necessity for earnest and united efforts on the part of all citizens to render this institution in every respect a worthy representative of the intelligence and liberality of the citizens of Rochester.







COURSES OF STUDY.

In order to secure that more thorough and extensive course of study contemplated in the establishment of the High School, and to render more efficient every department of instruction, the Board of Education have designated the following preparatory studies for the Senior Departments of the public schools of the city. An accurate and thorough acquaintance with these studies will be an indispensable requisite for admission into the High School.

PREPARATORY STUDIES.

Orthography, Practical Arithmetic, Penmanship,
Reading, Higher Arithmetic, Physical Geography,
Penmanship, United States History, Primary Physiology,
Mental Arithmetic, English Grammar, Elements of Algebra.

Students entering the High School will be classified in one of the three following courses of study, viz: the Academic, the College Preparatory, or the Eclectic Course.

ACADEMIC COURSE.

This embraces a range of studies which will demand for its accomplishment full three years. It is designed to make this course of study fully equal to those of the best Seminaries of our country. Students who satisfactorily complete this course will receive a Diploma of Graduation, signed by the Principal of the school, the Superintendent and the President of the Board of Education.

Studies marked with a star in the first and second years, may be omitted by substituting Ornamentals, or one of the Modern Languages; in the third year by substituting Ornamentals, or one of the Ancient Languages.

COLLEGE PREPARATORY.

This will embrace a course of study in the Ancient Languages and the Mathematics sufficiently extensive to prepare students to enter any of our best Colleges. No student will be permitted to sacrifice accurate and thorough scholarship for the sake of rapid progress.

ECLECTIC COURSE.

STUDENTS not designing to graduate at the High School, nor to enter College, will be classified in the Eclectic Course. This will

embrace such studies, selected from those taught at the High School, as may be best adapted to promote the specific end desired by the scholar. The Principal will be happy to consult freely with parents concerning the best course of study to be pursued, in any case of doubt.

RHETORICAL EXERCISES.

ALL students are required to present Compositions once in two weeks—the gentlemen to alternate every other week with Declamations. To secure that efficiency in these duties which is essential to progress, these exercises are made regular recitations, the entire school being organized into classes of Declamation and Composition. Thus each scholar comes under the personal criticism of the teacher. In addition to these regular duties, two papers, the "Student's Miscellany," edited by the gentlemen, and "The Repository," edited by the ladies, consisting of original contributions, are sustained by the best talent of the school. The young gentlemen have also organized and successfully commenced a Debating Society, denominated the "High School Lyceum."

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THESE are not contained in any published code with their respective penalties attached, but each student entering the High School is made to feel that in assuming the high position of a scholar certain rights and duties are acquired and imposed. The prompt recognition of these mutual rights and obligations is made imperative. These are sustained by appeals to the sense of justice and right existing in every scholar, and it is clearly understood that



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any student who shall by unworthy conduct forfeit the confidence of his fellow students and teachers, cannot remain a member of the High School.

EXAMINATIONS.

THESE will be held at the close of each term. An examining committee, appointed by the Board of Education, will be present, and their report in connection with the teachers' report for the term, will designate candidates for advancement in the course and for graduation. Excellence of scholarship, and not length of time, will be the criterion of advancement.

EXAMINATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

These will be annual, to be held at the close of the winter term of the Public Schools, at such place or places as may be hereafter designated.
