16-year-old Shira is on a mission to find the perfect boyfriend this Hannukah, but he might be closer than she thinks.




Ellen Outside the Lines by A.J. Sass

Neurodivergent teen, Ellen Katz, discovers new friendships and expands her horizons on a scavenger-hunt-style school trip through Barcelona.




The Ghosts of Rose Hill by R.M. Romero


The Courage to Dream by Neal Shusterman


Lion's Legacy by Lev A.C. Rosen

17-year-old Tennessee Russo tries to get over a breakup by going on an adventure with his reality-star archeologist Dad.




Night Owls by A.R. Vishny




Going Bicoastal by Dahlia Adler

Zoe examines her relationship with gender and sexuality on a fall break trip from NYC to Seattle.




The Blood Years by Elana K. Arnold

The harrowing story of a young girl's struggle to survive in Holocaust-era Romania, inspired by the true story of the author's grandmother's childhood.




The Judgment of Yoyo Gold by Isaac Blum

The Girl Who Sang by Estelle Nadel

A heartrending graphic memoir about the author's childhood and her fight for survival in Holocaust-era Poland.



Black Bird, Blue Road by Sofiya Pasternack

In this historical Fantasy novel, Ziva works with a half-demon boy to save her brother, Pesah, from succumbing to leprosy before the Angel of Death can claim him.



Wrath Becomes Her by Aden Polydoros

A grieving father in 1943 Lithuania uses forbidden magic to create a golem which will avenge his daughter's death at the hand of nazis.
