Bessie and her classmate's spring break party at a remote English castle turns deadly as a storm traps them with a killer, forcing them to unravel growing suspicions while the body count rises.




**Two Sides to Every Murder


**The Bitter End

by Vincent Ralph**





Sixteen-year-old Greta attempts to reinvent herself at her amusement park summer job, but things take a deadly turn when a co-worker disappears.




Four Letter Word By Gretchen McNeil


When We Go Missing by April Henry

After discovering a camera memory card with hundreds of photos of teenage girls, seventeen-year-olds Willow and Dare set out to find some of them who have gone missing.




These Deadly Prophecies by Andrea Tang


Six Truths and a Lie by Ream Shukairy


We Are Villains by Kacen Callender


I Will Follow by Eireann Corrigan
